Interdisciplinary program on cultural, political, and ecological dimensions of ocean convenes artists and global thought-leaders from January 25 – 27, 2018, during Singapore Art Week

The Current Convening #3 organized by TBA21-Academy with curator Ute Meta Bauer in collaboration with NTU Centre for Contemporary Art Singapore

WHAT:

TBA21–Academy and curator **Ute Meta Bauer** (founding director, NTU CCA Singapore) foster new opportunity for ocean advocacy through a vibrant symposium held during Singapore Art Week. Convening a diverse range of thought-leaders—including artists, musicians, environmental researchers, conservationists, anthropologists, and government officials—with Fijian collaborators and community groups, the three-day program features discursive events, roundtable discussions, workshops, and performances. The event marks the culmination of Bauer's tenure as an expedition leader of **The Current**, a three-year fellowship program of TBA21–Academy, which included voyages to Papua New Guinea, French Polynesia, and Fiji. Joined by her fellow expedition participants, the program **fosters an open dialogue about environmental urgencies and their implications on international law, policy-making, education, and artistic practices.**

In conjunction with the event, NTU Centre for Contemporary Art Singapore is presenting *The Oceanic*, an exhibition featuring commissioned works from the artists who joined Bauer on her expeditions, as well as videos and material captured over the three-year program.

The program will also include publication launch and reception on Saturday, January 27 of <u>Tidalectics: Imagining an Ocean Worldview through Art and Science</u> (Published by MIT Press and TBA21–Academy), a new publication by TBA21–Academy resulting

from its ongoing commissioning of new research and investigations into the ocean

by scholars from a diverse range of fields.

WHO: The Convening #3 is organized by TBA21–Academy in collaboration with NTU Centre

for Contemporary Art Singapore. The program is curated by Markus Reymann, Director of TBA21–Academy, Stefanie Hessler, Curator of TBA21–Academy, and

Professor Ute Meta Bauer, Founding Director of NTU CCA Singapore.

ABOUT TBA21-ACADEMY

Founded by Francesca von Habsburg and drawing on her experience as a producer of cross-disciplinary art installations and socially engaged cultural programming, TBA21–Academy leads artists, scientists, and thought-leaders on expeditions of collaborative discovery. Its mission is to foster a deeper understanding of our ocean through the lens of art and to engender creative solutions to its most pressing issues. Led by Director Markus Reymann and supported by curator Stefanie Hessler, the itinerant Academy commissions interdisciplinary research that catalyzes engagement, stimulates new knowledge, and inspires artistic production. Established in 2011, the non-profit's program is informed by a belief in the power of exchange between disciplines and in the ability of the arts as a vessel for communication, change, and action.

ABOUT THE CURRENT

The Current is a pioneering TBA21—Academy fellowship program designed to cultivate transdisciplinary practice and the exchange of ideas, bringing thought-leaders from diverse fields on expeditions throughout the Pacific. Taking inspiration from the ocean tides, the initiative is organized in three-year cycles and led by curators (Expedition Leaders) selected by TBA21—Academy. Expedition Leaders guide one expedition annually and propose fellow participants to join on the journeys aboard the Dardanella. Leaders and participants subsequently contribute to a Convening, held approximately six months after each expedition, that engage local communities and the public with experiences and lessons learned from their fieldwork in the Pacific.
